

# Kennebecasis Regional Police Force

## Auxiliary Program Tier 1



Auxiliary members are drawn from a wide cross-section of the community. The auxiliary members can be seen performing duties such as initial and emergency response to calls with regular members, traffic and crowd control, crime scene security, and community policing initiatives.

Auxiliary Constables are sworn in as Peace Officers pursuant to the NB Police Act and have the powers and authority of a peace officer but only when accompanied by and under the supervision of a regular police officer. Auxiliary Officers do not carry firearms.

**Persons interested in becoming an Auxiliary Officer should be aware of and consider the following:**

- Auxiliary duties may involve exposure to dangerous situations or confrontations.
- Life insurance for Auxiliary Officers is not provided by the KRPF.
- A minimum of 144 hours per year is required of all Auxiliary Officers.
- Auxiliary Officers are not permitted to drive KRPF police vehicles unless directed by the Sergeant on duty. For this reason, all Auxiliary Officers must possess an endorsement to drive government vehicles on their personal insurance coverage.
- Auxiliary duties can be long and physically arduous or monotonous and boring but must be performed regardless of the nature.
- Auxiliary duties may be emotionally upsetting as members can become involved in unpleasant and traumatic situations.
- Auxiliary Officers are required to testify in court.
- Auxiliary Officers are required to follow orders implicitly; conforming to the operational and administrative policies of the Kennebecasis Regional Police Force.

-Auxiliary Officers will be required to qualify for a security clearance as well as swear to the Oath of Office and Secrecy in order to serve with the KRPF. It is of utmost importance that successful candidates maintain the highest level of privacy, secrecy, and discretion. Failure to do so will result in immediate termination.

Auxiliary Officers are expected to attend both classroom and practical training which includes but is not limited to:

First Aid & CPR

Criminal Code and other legal issues in policing

Weapons handling

Report writing and note taking

Use of Mobile Data Browsers

Applications will be screened to ensure that all basic requirements are met. Applicants will be required to pass an interview before a board that includes members of the Auxiliary Officer Committee, members of KRPF Management, and members of the KRPF Joint Board of Police Commissioners.

Applicants will be subject to an enhanced security background check as well as a security interview. Applicants will be required to pass a medical/physical examination to Kennebecasis Regional Police Force standards. Successful applicants will be required to undergo mandatory training as directed by the Kennebecasis Regional Police Force prior to commencing operational duties.

Successful candidates must be aware that their position as Auxiliary Officer can be terminated at any time at the sole discretion of the Chief of Police or their designate.
